## You must bring along the following:

Should all fit into an A3 box or fat quarter bag

	Sketchbook A4
	Pencil case – black felt tip pen, pencil, eraser, sharpener, glue-stick etc.
	Coloured pencils or crayons or little paint set, whatever you like to use for colour
	5 x A4 white printer paper or lightweight card
	Tracing paper A4 pad or 6 sheets
	20 A4 coloured papers, plain colours and printed
	4 pages black/white line patterns eg. colouring book pages or a page of b/w newspaper
	6 x fine art pictures by your favourite artist. It could also be a grandchild's picture
	10 original and graphic photos that you have taken. Take a walk with a camera or phone and
	select 10 photos of simple patterns or bold shapes. eg. close up nature, shadows on paths,
	ladders, gates, keyholes, doorway, pegs on line, weave on baskets, grids, mesh, jar of nuts,
	sewing machine tools, machine dials, pincushion, ornate architecture, decorative trims,
	chairs, groups or multiples of things, shoes, stones, flowers, sticks, reels of thread, fruit in
	bowl, packaged food stacked, pattern on shoe sole, animal fur, books, windows, stamp
_	collection, toys, your treasures. Please print 10 images.
	2 small/very small, interesting objects eg. button, peg, leaf, key, coin, gumnut, memory stick,
	jewellery charm, keyring, token, badge, sticker, brooch, lolly, travel souvenir, paperclip 6 pictures of modern quilts that appeal to you. Do a Google or Pinterest search eg. the
	modern quilt. Quilt magazines are great sources too.
	3 x fabric selvedges including the little circles of colour, from your favourite fabrics
	Rotary cutter, ruler, cutting mat.
	Scissors for paper & fabric
	Sewing basket; scissors, neutral thread, quilting thread, flower pins and needles

FABRICS	
Should	all fit into another fat quarter bag
	I metre iron-on Pellon
	50cm fusible web
	Low volume fabrics (small amounts). These are fabrics that 'read' as light fabrics but at the
	same time have a secondary pattern or design. Just one of these fabrics can be used as the
	background for a quilt or many can be combined eg. layer cake, jelly roll, themed prints, pale
	spot, check, stripe fabrics. Also some scraps of solid fabric. Choose a colour group eg. greys,
	or perhaps your favourite colours – to be found in your scrap bag
	Fat quarters: 10-20 of your favourite solid fabrics eg. bright and paler tones
