



## **CLASS REQUIREMENTS**

### **Class: Trapunto Balloon Mini Quilt**

Dates: Thursday April 11 – Friday April 12, 2019

Times: 10am – 5pm

Tutor: Katherine Jones

### **You must bring along the following:**

- Balloon Fabric - 7 pieces of fabric 10" x 4" (25cm x 10cm) with at least two different prints
- Sky background fabric – 1 to 3 fat quarters or 20" (50cm) squares – light blue sky solid or tone-on-tone is recommended
- Batting and backing fabric 20" (50cm) square
- Paper scissors
- Small fabric scissors
- Glue pen gluestick (Sewline recommended)
- Liquid appliqué glue (Roxanne's recommended)
- Marking pen or pencil
- Basting spray or pins
- 12wt or 16wt pearl cotton in black, dark brown or dark grey for balloon strings and basket –Wonderfil Spaghetti, Presencia or Aurfil recommended – must be in a ball or spool, not a skein.
- Quilting thread of your choice (for background quilting only) – white 40 weight cotton recommended
- Stitch ripper
- Size 100 sewing machine needles
- Self threading needles (optional)

- Pattern for mini quilt
- Printed freezer paper template
- Puffy batting for trapunto
- Bobbin of monopoly thread for appliqué
- Two 2 inch bias strips of white fabric for creating background

**REQUIREMENTS TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT (at home):**

- Binding fabric

**Sewing machines** will be provided by sponsor companies so you don't need to bring your own. A technical assistant from that company will be available to assist any students who are unfamiliar with that machine. **If you prefer to bring your own sewing machine**, you may, but please ensure it is well maintained and that you bring the instruction manual, tools and accessories.

**Suggestions:** Please make sure you label everything with your name.

- We also recommend bringing a cushion in case your chair doesn't suit your height
- A water bottle helps you stay hydrated
